

Authors must learn to brand themselves along with their product. They must understand the competition inside them between the writer, the agent, and the publisher. They must realize their book is a product, not a work of art.

Attendees will learn how to value themselves as a business and their book as a product; how to gain free publicity on a national level through media releases and local exposure, and other ways to make an income through school visits, library discussions, and conferences.





- 10. Absolutely, positively NO: rape, bestiality, sex with underage people, or all the other things you would expect to be forbidden.
- 11. Previously published works are definitely acceptable, providing electronic rights have reverted to the author.
- 12. Works that have been published through a self-publishing venture (i.e.: Smashwords, Kindle Direct/Kindle Prime) will not be accepted.
- 13. Agents and current Untreed Reads authors may submit directly to: Jay Hartman.

14. All submissions need to be sent in their entirety in RTF, DOC or ODP formats, Times New Roman, 12 pt. This rule does not necessarily apply to current Untreed Reads authors or agents. # Prepare Your Submissions for Saw Palm 2014, submissions are accepted between July 1 and October 1<sup>st</sup>.

Saw Palm is a Florida-themed journal, however we welcome writers and artists from across the country and the globe as long as the work is connected to Florida (via images, people, themes, et cetera). We also welcome creative works from Floridians that are not obviously about someplace else. Please check out past issues, available for download as free PDFs. We publish one issue per year in the spring.

Saw Palm does not accept work that was previously published either online or in print. We welcome simultaneous submissions as long as you immediately notify Saw Palm of acceptance elsewhere. Response time varies between 1 to 6 months. Our general reading period is between July 1st and October 1st, however submissions for Places to Stand in Florida are accepted year-round.

All submissions must be made electronically through our online submissions manager. Please upload prose and poetry files in .doc or .docx formats only. Art, photography, and comics should be uploaded in .jpeg / .jpg format only. Paper submissions sent via snail mail will be recycled unread. Click here to submit.

#### **Poetry**

We accept up to five poems per submission period at a maximum of 10 pages. Please send all poems in one document.

#### **Fiction**

We ask that fiction submissions be no longer than 6000 words. Please send only one story per reading period.

#### **Flash Fiction**

We accept up to three works of flash fiction (750 words or less) per submission period. Please send all stories in one document.

#### **Creative Nonfiction**

We ask that submissions of memoir and essays be no longer than 6000 words. Please send only one piece per reading period.

#### **Art & Photography**

We accept up to five submissions of art or photography per reading period. Please send files in .jpeg / .jpg format only. You may also include a URL if a portfolio of your work is online.

#### **Comics**

We welcome submissions of graphic fiction and nonfiction of up to seven pages, whether in black & white, greyscale, or full color. Submit in .jpeg / .jpg format only. Keep in mind that the journal's dimensions are smaller (5"x7") than the average literary journal and so comics with small panels filled with intricate art are not well-suited.

#### **Interviews**

We are especially interested in interviews of Florida writers and artists, although we're open to almost any Florida-related subject. Please query us about the interview subject first, via email.

#### **Reviews** (appear on sawpalm.org)

We are interested in reviews of any Florida-related subject: author, book, film, tourist attraction, CD, website, beach, park, toll roads, snack stands, local landmarks—anything! These reviews will appear on www.sawpalm.org. Unlike submissions of creative work, current or recent USF students and faculty are welcome to submit reviews. Size limit: 6000 words.

#### **Places to Stand in Florida** (appears on sawpalm.org)

Please tell us what it's like to stand at a specific place in Florida at a specific time of day in 500 words or less. While we enjoy the unusual, locations should be public and accessible (so not your bathroom!) Please include GPS coordinates.

Unlike other categories, current or recent USF students and faculty are welcome to submit pieces for the Places to Stand series.

Poems submitted as part of the Places to Stand series are welcome but should be justified left and otherwise not have complex formatting and spacing. This is due to technical limitations in Google Earth.

#### Update March 2016:

Sawpalm just released their 10th Anniversary Issue with the special theme—Florida-Cuba Connection.

They plan to return to the Florida theme for future issues. While submissions for the journal won't open until July 1st, they take submissions for the online literary map, "Places to Stand," year round. For this category, they accept short (500 word max) submissions of nonfiction and poetry that show what it's like to stand at a particular spot in Florida at a particular moment in time.

This month, I am providing Holly's advice on looking for the good to create your story rather than the negative. These trying times are providing a lot of negative, and I hope you look for the positive and help write it forward. Maybe some optimism is needed from all corners of the universe.

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See what's good

The news is a nightmare. Economic disaster, environmental disaster, political disaster, war, disease, murder, psychopaths, terrorists...

I remember in 1966, riding to East Liverpool into the Ohio Valley with my dad. As you came over the ridge and started down into the valley, you could see the yellow air below. As soon as the car rolled into the smog, your eyes and your throat would start to burn. Steel mills, pottery mills, and other heavy industry clogged the air.

In 1969, in my home state, Ohio, the Cuyahoga River caught fire...for something like the fifth or sixth time.

In 1970, Lake Erie was declared dead, and it was estimated that no fish would be able to live in it again for thousands of years.

And we had Vietnam, Nixon and Watergate, drugs and despair.

You're a writer, and there is a huge temptation to buy into the news. To play the "if this continues" extrapolation game right into your own end of the world doomsday scenario. Y2K and The Fall Of All Civilization, anyone?

But no matter how tempted you are, you need to look at the world through your own eyes. NOT the eyes of the media.

Rahm Emanuel blessed us all with an utterly honest (and accidentally uncensored) comment about the value of disaster to politicians: "You never let a serious crisis go to waste. And what I mean by that it's an opportunity to do things you think you could not do before."

He told the truth. But it isn't a new truth. He said what politicians and newsmen have been doing since politics and news began. Scare people, and grab power. Create a crisis, blow a

small issue into a big one, manufacture the news, and make people think you're the one who can save them.

And while you're at it, sell lots of advertising time on your news programs, ad inches in your papers, and ad pixels on your internet site.

The news is a nightmare.

The news has ALWAYS been and will ALWAYS be a nightmare.

The news and the folks who flog the news get PAID to print what sells. Fear, horror, blood, devastation, and despair... those are what sells to the masses.

Ask the Romans. They made an art form out of creatively murdering people in front of an audience to keep the poor pacified---"bread and circuses" sold then, and "bread and circuses" sell now. Ask any news anchor.

Fear is not the truth, though.

The truth is that people (the same people who make things worse) can also make them better. Today, you can breathe the air in Pittsburgh, East Liverpool, and anywhere else in the Ohio River Valley. The heavy industry is gone. Economically, this is not great. Breathing-wise? Very helpful.

1969 is the LAST time the Cuyahoga River caught fire. Why? Because people decided to get off their asses and fix the problem---and the Cuyahoga River is now primarily filled with water. Lake Erie has both native fish species and native plant species in place again. It isn't perfect yet---but it isn't thousands of years later, either. People took action. Things got better. Nixon ENDED Vietnam, and things got better.

People discovered Nixon's paranoia and corruption, and the weight of public opinion forced him to resign. Things got better.

People dream, imagine, act, and create, and THINGS GET BETTER.

The computer upon which you received this e-mail is more powerful than the entire computing set-up NASA used to send men to the moon, and one guy working in his garage laid the foundation for you to have this magnificent piece of equipment, not for millions of dollars, but for a couple thousand. Maybe, if you've bought a computer recently, for a few hundred. We can e-mail each other instead of writing letters that have to be delivered by plane and truck through costly service centers. We have satellites that allow us to communicate with each other instantly.

We can create and reach out directly to the people who have an interest in what we create, thought mechanisms as previously exotic and unthinkable as eBay, Amazon, our own personal web site.

We can chat with just about anyone, anywhere, at any time, via cellphone. I heard from my Air Force kid, who's stationed in the desert. I didn't have to wait for a letter. He called. Real time. "Hey, Mom, I miss you. I'm okay."

Tell me there isn't a mother during World War II who wouldn't have given every bite of rationed

food in the house for one phone call like that.

If you want to write a book and publish it yourself, you can go to any of a number of web businesses that won't charge you a dime for setting up your book as a print-on-demand, bound, full-color, gorgeous ready-to-go production.

Your LIFE is not the news. You were born, you will die, and in between that unchangeable start and stop, you will grow, learn, love, imagine, create, build, dare, fall, skin your knees, break your heart, laugh with friends, weep from loss, take risks, fail, succeed...

Your life can be wonderful, if you dare to see the good in front of your eyes, instead of the bad that people get paid to PUT in front of your eyes.

And your stories will be richer, your characters more full.

Yes, bad things happen. Yes, you may end up in the middle of one or more of them in your life time. I was in the BIG Guatemala earthquake in 1976. People I love have died. Terrible things happened to my two older kids when they were little.

Bad things happen. I know this better than most. I was an RN for ten years, mostly working ER and ICU. I know what death looks like. But I didn't take death as a given. I fought it, one dying patient at a time. A lot of times, I and the other people who worked with me won.

If you're lucky, you live through the bad, you pick yourself up, and you move on. Everyone dies.

It's what we do while we're alive that matters---and we can be part of creating what's bad, be a part of spreading fear, be a part of destroying hope and joy, be a part of contributing to the heat death of the universe.

Or we can see the good. We can understand that we have it in ourselves to create what is wonderful. Something that shows people who, when faced with horror and despair, pick themselves up and make things better.

And seeing the good...

We can write the good.

Write with joy. Know that when you do, it MATTERS.
